Chamaecyparis obtusa	Golden Sprite	Golden Sprite Japanese Hinoki Cypress	1'	N/A	N/A	sun-part shade	Forms a cute, tight, small, rounded, flat bun-shaped specimen which becomes slightly less regular with age. Leaves are a rich golden yellow gradually shading to green towards the plants interior. Small stems are delicately twisted. A true dwarf gem!
Chamaecyparis obtusa	Just Dandy, Nana Gracilis	Just Dandy Hinoki Cypress	3 - 5'	N/A	N/A	sun-part shade	Forms a dense compact, rounded specimen of fine textured dark, green foliage. Superb addition to any dwarf planting.
Chamaecyparis pisifera	Cumulus	Cumulus Falsecypress	6 - 8"	N/A	N/A	sun	Extremely dwarf form of the Sawara Cypress displaying unique blue-gray foliage. Produces a globe shaped specimen composed of dense, soft feathery almost needle-like leaves arranged in "cloud-like" tufts. Remains small without pruning.

New growth is curled and strikingly tipped white. Requires an open sunny location plus a well drained acid soil.
Chamaecyparis pisifera	White Pygmy	White Pygmy Sawara Cypress	12"	N/A	N/A	sun	A striking and unusual dwarf form of the Japanese Sawara False Cypress with white young foliage. Beautiful color contrast is maintained throughout the growing season. Forms a low, flat bun shaped specimen, ideal for dwarf plantings.
Juniperus horizontalis	Mother Lode	Mother Lode Juniper	3 - 4"	N/A	N/A	sun-part shade	Bright golden-yellow foliage retains its unique color in full sun or partial shade all summer changing to a rich burgundy-plum in winter.
Metasequoia glyptostroboides	Miss Grace	Miss Grace Weeping Dawn Redwood	8 - 10'	N/A	N/A	sun-part shade	Strongly pendulous branches enhanced by soft, feathery small bright green deciduous foliage turning orange-brown in fall. Excellent as a specimen or as an accent!

Picea glauca	Jean's Dilly	Jean's Dilly Spruce	2'	N/A	N/A	sun	Extraordinary Dwarf Alberta Spruce distinguished by its smaller stature and shorter thinner gray-green needles which display a distinctive twist at the end of the shoots.
Picea glauca	Pixie Dust	Pixie Dust Spruce	18"	N/A	N/A	sun	Dwarf, dense pyramidal White Spruce with large, prominent rounded buds that in spring produce short dark-green needles with a slight blue-green coat.
Pinus mugo	Teeny	Teeny Pine	2 - 3'	N/A	N/A	sun	True, dwarf Mugo Pine forming a tight globose specimen that will not outgrow the smallest of spaces. Needles are tiny, uniformly straight, rich evergreen spokes that grow thickly on abundant branches.

Tsuga canadensis	Jean Iseli	Jean Iseli Candian Hemlock	16 - 18"	N/A	N/A	sun	Extremely short darkish green needles. Its pleasing delicate texture results from the formation of short branches intermittently along the new growth and only slightly longer than the needles.
Tsuga canadensis	Moon Frost	Moon Frost Canadian Hemlock	3 - 5'	N/A	N/A	part shade	Variegated Canadian Hemlock with bright white new spring growth is reminiscent of frost on a moonlit night, older inner foliage retains light tones and whitish appearance. During winter, the white foliage is often blushed pink.
Tsuga diversifolia	Loowit	Loowit Japanese Hemlock	15 - 18"	N/A	N/A	sun	Diminutive short branches and shoots form a tight, congested bun covered with short, blunt needles that resemble green rice grains interspersed with the tiny brown buds.
